PENNSYLVANIA JUVENILE JUSTICE SYSTEM

FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

In Pennsylvania, juveniles incur an obligation to the victim and community when they commit a crime. The juvenile justice system has a responsibility to hold juveniles accountable to repair the harm their crimes caused. This responsibility sometimes includes a financial obligation, such as restitution or payment to the Crime Victim's Compensation Fund. When a financial obligation is imposed, juveniles often have an opportunity to fulfill that obligation through paid community service.
