## PENNSYLVANIA JUVENILE JUSTICE SYSTEM PADRAI

The Pennsylvania Detention Risk Assessment Instrument (PaDRAI) is an objective assessment tool that helps probation officers and probation departments decide whether to securely detain a youth, release the youth to an alternative to detention (ATD), or release the youth to the custody of a parent or responsible adult while the youth is awaiting their juvenile court hearing. The PaDRAI is designed to minimize bias while promoting fair and transparent decisions for the use of secure detention and ATD. The PaDRAI generates a score based on objective, evidencebased risk factors. These six risk factors are: the most serious alleged offense; additional related charges or pending charges; current supervision status; prior adjudication or consent decree findings; history of failure to appear; and history of escape or runaway.
